

Post-operative Patient Instruction:

Dilatation & Curettage (D&C), Hysteroscopy, Endometrial Ablation

- You will find that you have completely forgotten what we told you we found, due to the effects of anesthesia. Even though your family or friend with you has seen a picture or drawing to help you remember, the doctor wants to talk to YOU about it. A post-operative check-up 2-3 week after your procedure should be scheduled with the doctor who performed your surgery.
- 2. You should expect to have some mild bleeding or spotting and possibly some mild uterine cramps. In addition, you may have watery vaginal discharge.
- 3. If your surgery was related to pregnancy, the next period should be expected in 4-6 weeks. If you haven't started a period by 8weeks, call the office to speak to your doctor.
- 4. Do not put anything in the vagina until your follow-up visit (i.e. tampons, intercourse, douching).
- 5. The effects of anesthesia can last 24-48 hours. DO not drive, operate dangerous machinery, sign any legal documents or make any important decisions during this time.
- 6. All other normal activities may be resumed after 24-48 hours, including exercise.
- 7. Advil or Motrin is best used for cramping, while Tylenol can be used for other types of pain. Avoid aspirin use.
- 8. Baths, swimming and hot-tubs are permitted if bleeding and discharge are minimal.
- 9. If you have a fever over 101 F, or experience severe abdominal pain, heavy bleeding (saturating a pad every hour), painful urination, unrelenting vomiting or have a malodorous discharge, call the office immediately.

For LEEP, Cryosurgery Cold Knife Conization of Cervix

All of the above apply except:

Put nothing in the vagina for 1 month. Your check-up should be scheduled 4 weeks after your procedure.
